

# Targeted Earlier Intervention

Getting Ready for Reports

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## What we know so far

Try test and learn is well and truly over and the first compulsory data reporting period for TEI (January to end June 2021) is closed. Data can no longer be entered for previous reporting periods.

All organisations signed up to the Data Exchange (DEX) have access to the DSS Standard Reports.

All organisations signed up to the Partnership Approach (mandatory for TEI funded services) have access to additional reports, including the TEI Activity Report. Click [this link](#) if you are not yet signed up to the Partnership Approach.

The Sector is being encouraged to check your data against contracted activities. The reports are a useful review tool to use to improve your data quality for the duration of your contract [Using data in the TEI Program](#).

The Sector is also being encouraged to utilise the DEX reports to improve the quality of the services that you deliver [Using data to improve our services](#).

DCJ Central Office is working with any TEI service providers who are not yet signed up to the Data Exchange. Districts will be urging service providers who have not entered any TEI data in the Data Exchange to start to do so as a matter of urgency.

## What happens next

DCJ Districts will be using the TEI data to have contract conversations with service providers.

DCJ Districts and service providers will have the opportunity to use the demographic data available through the TEI Activity Report to have service system conversations about need and emerging issues and communities.

TEI SCORE data will be utilised in conversations about client and community outcomes.
